
## FOOD SALES LICENSING AND INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS



\* Annual permits are valid for one year from issue date and must be renewed annually. Inspections by the state may occur at any event at any time. Permit holder must pass inspection of adherence to proper food handling guidelines or be asked to leave the Market. License/Permit must be on site with vendor each Market day as required by the state.

Annual Food Permit: Required inspection and license of food packaging/preparation location by the state.

**Annual Mobile Food Permit:** Required for packaged foods to be sold away from the location it was prepared. This license is required to be on site with vendor at all times as required by the state.

Ready to Eat Foods: Any food item prepared/assembled/cooked at the site it is sold.

Packaged Foods: Food cooked/baked at another location and brought to the Market for sale that are not Cottage Foods.

Cottage Foods: Any food defined as Cottage Food by the State of Florida.
